Roundtable "Information ecosystem and troubled democracy"

The <u>Observatory</u> of the Forum on Information and Democracy <u>has launched</u> its first metaanalysis in January 2025. The <u>report</u> consists in a meta-analysis of more than 1600 academic publications and scientific reports (selected among a total corpus of over +2700 resources aggregated). It provides a critical assessment of the role of information ecosystems in the Global North and Global Majority World, focusing on their relationship with information integrity (the quality of public discourse), the fairness of political processes, the protection of media freedoms, and the resilience of public institutions. The report is set to provide a global understanding of the current structure of the information and communication space and its impact on public debate and democracy around the world.

The Global Launch is followed by a series of events hosted by research centers and partners around the world.

These events are aimed at:

- Disseminating the results of the Observatory's first research cycle
- Highlight research consensus and dissensus, gaps and priorities for the scientific community, including regional and disciplinary variations
- Share actionable insights for different sectors and regions
- Emulate a broader community of actors to join this global meta research effort

In this framework, we are keen to organize a dedicated event on the report's findings at the <u>National University of Political Studies and Public Administration</u>, hosted under the umbrella of the <u>Center for EU communication studies</u>.
